

How Can You Help Enforce Colorado's Clean Indoor Air Act?

Smoke-free laws are designed to protect people from secondhand smoke in public places and at work. You can help make sure that these regulations work as they are intended.

1) Know the Extent of the Law

Familiarize yourself with the extent of the <u>Colorado Clean Indoor Air Act</u> before taking any action. Restaurants, bars, most workplaces, and most other public establishments covered by the law are responsible for complying with the law.

2) Report Violations

When you report a violation, you are performing a public service for yourself, the workers, and others who are involuntarily exposed to secondhand smoke. As defined by the law, violators are subject to a \$200 fine for the first violation, a \$300 fine for the second violation and a \$500 fine for every violation each day thereafter within a calendar year.

3) File a Complaint and Keep Records
